

#### 70 YEARS AGO...

In 1947 India was on the brink of immense change. Lord Mountbatten, the last Viceroy of India, was to be key in the events throughout India's last months as a British colony. These crucial months of negotiations and debates with Jinnah, Nehru, Gandhi and the British Government resulted in the independence of India and the founding of Pakistan.

This became known as the **partition** of India, and had far-reaching consequences for Hindus, Sikhs and Muslims alike.







**EMPIRE AND INDEPENDENCE** 


Viceroy's House, directed by Gurinder Chadha, tells the remarkable true story of partition in the setting of Mountbatten's residence in India. Upstairs the difficult political negotiations take place with Nehru, Jinnah, Gandhi and the British government. While downstairs the social impact of the divide is reflected through the eyes of a young Hindu, Jeet, and a Muslim, Aalia, whose relationship is forbidden.

Starring Hugh Bonneville, Gillian Anderson, Manish Dayal, Huma Qureshi and Michael Gambon, *Viceroy's House* hits cinemas on 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2017, just in time for the UK-wide commemorations of the 70th anniversary of India's independence and the founding of Pakistan.






# WHAT CAN YOU INFER ABOUT THESE EVENTS FROM THE MAP?

Watch the trailer for *Viceroy's House* carefully. Listen specifically for reasons WHY India might have been partitioned?





- Is there enough evidence for this theory?





You could also decide upon what category they fit into: economic, social, political or environmental.








