

Zuheros

Zuheros is a Spanish municipality in the province of Córdoba, Andalusia. In 2016, it had 657 inhabitants.¹ Its surface area is 42.31 km² and it has a density of 15.53 inhabitants / km².

Its geographical coordinates are 37° 32 'N, 4° 19' W. It is located at an altitude of 656 meters and 76 kilometers from the provincial capital, Córdoba. Most of their houses are white. It is located in the Sierra de la Subbética, between the towns of Doña Mencía and Luque.

Zuheros' monuments

The cave of the Bats is a prehistoric cave of Andalusia, located in full Subbetic mountains, specifically 4 km from Zuheros, in the south of the province of Córdoba and is the largest cave in this province. Bats of different species inhabit it. The cave was declared of cultural interest in 1985 and on November 23, 2001, the Junta de Andalucía declared its 32 hectares as a natural monument.
